Are You a Good Neighbor?



- Boaters, please slow to “no wake” in our coves.
- Sound waves carry on the water, and barking dogs are a real problem.

Abbeville County has a noise ordinance:

It states as unlawful: “Allowing or permitting an animal to bark, whine, howl, yowl, crow, or cackle continuously for 20 minutes or longer, or to make other noises in such a manner as to interfere with the reasonable use or enjoyment of adjoining or nearby properties.” You can call the Sheriff’s Department at 446-6000.

TOP 10 RULES OF RESPECTFUL BOATING – MAKE THE RIGHT KIND OF WAVES

Remember, these are guidelines and should not serve as a replacement for learning the rules, regulations and laws for your local body of water. Whether you’re a novice or veteran boater, learn more by taking a boating safety course.

1. Respect the ramp. Good boating etiquette starts before you enter the water - at the dock. Prepare your boat and equipment before getting into position to launch. Anything else is disrespectful to fellow boaters.

2. Own your wake. The fastest way to make the wrong kinds of waves is to literally throw a big, obtrusive wave at another boat, swimmer, angler or shoreline owner. This is much more than being a nuisance or disrupting others’ experience on the water. It’s dangerous to those unable to tolerate a large wake. Stay at least 200 feet from the shoreline and other boaters.

3. Keep the tunes in check. Sound is amplified over the water, so keep the music at a decent level. Not only is it a disturbance to others but the operator may not hear the spotter.

4. Pack in. Pack out. Seems like common sense, right? Yet shorelines are still lined with trash being thrown overboard. Take care of the body of water you love and dispose of any trash you have. Do not throw it overboard! **5. Slow your roll.** Adhere to slow-no-wake restriction? It’s your responsibility to know it and respect it. You are responsible for any damage you cause to other people’s property.

6. Rules of the road. Become familiar with waterway markers and navigation rules, which dictate how you operate your vessel in order to prevent collision.

7. Be prepared. If you are the captain, you need to be prepared with the safety rules for your craft and make your guests aware as well. Know state and local laws for the body of water you’re on. Set a good example by always wearing a life jacket and have enough life jackets for each person onboard. Beyond that, make sure to have the appropriate fit.

8. Fuel and go. At the fuel dock, get fuel, pay your bill and move out of the way. If you need to buy additional supplies, relocate your boat. Don’t forget to run your blower before starting.

9. Anchoring and mooring. Enter an anchorage or mooring area at a slow speed. Don’t create a wake that will disrupt other anchored boats. The first boat sets the tone. Mimic how they tie off, how much line you use and how much distance you allow between you and other boats. The busier the boat, the more space you should give yourself.

10. Be polite – give a wave. When passing another boat, give a little wave hello. Boating is all about having fun and being part of the boating community. Embrace it, enjoy it, and share it for generations to come.



CICADAS INVASION CAUSING A BUZZ

Trillions of periodical cicadas have emerged from the ground this spring, bringing with them their loud buzzing and molted exoskeletons.

There are two groups of periodical cicadas — those that emerge every 13 years and those that emerge every 17 years. The cicadas around Lake Secession are primarily the 13-year Cicadas. For most of their lives, cicadas live underground and then emerge once the soil reaches 64 degrees.

Because they are temperature-dependent, their emergences may vary depending on the location. Since it warms up faster in southern states, such as South Carolina, the cicadas have emerged already this April, while in cooler states, such as those in the upper Midwest, they might not emerge until June.

This year, both the 13-year and the 17-year cicadas will emerge arriving in numbers that have not been seen in generations. The dual cicada brood emergence will primarily be seen in parts of Illinois and Iowa, as well as some parts of Kentucky, Missouri, Arkansas, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina and Virginia.

They mate, molt and then die, leaving behind their offspring to bury themselves into the soil and lay dormant until their brood's next cycle. They only last about a month above ground, and no, they aren't dangerous. Unlike locusts, which eat plants, cicadas get their nutrients from small branches. Most trees, however, will remain unharmed.

Still, experts advise not planting any new trees ahead of a periodical cicada emergence. You can put netting around small trees and shrubs to keep them away, making sure openings are no larger than 1/4 of an inch so the bugs can't get in.

The 13-year cicadas, called Brood XIX, have emerged in South Carolina and the Southeast recently. The 17-year cicadas, called Brood XIII, will appear predominantly in Illinois and Iowa in early summer. This will be the first time since 1803 that two broods emerged at the same time. The next time this happens will be 2037.

The overlap of these two broods has been dubbed by an expert as "cicada-geddon" — but it won't be the biggest cicada event. In 2076, the two largest broods — XIX and XIV — will come out together. "That is the cicada-palooza," University of Connecticut cicada expert John Cooley said.

The sound of cicadas is music, if you take the time to listen. It is a symphony 13 years in the making. So don't let it bug you. Enjoy!

DOCK FEE UPDATE 05/29/2024:

Since our last update, we want to share/note the following:

1. We are still waiting on the City of Abbeville's Response—so this item is OPEN. Once we hear back from them, we will let you know.
 - a. Several dock owners filed pleadings requesting the Court issue an injunction against the City of Abbeville on Wednesday, May 15, 2024. The City was served with legal process on Thursday, May 16, 2024. **They have "30" days to respond.** Their 30 days will be up on Monday-June 17th (since the 15th is on a weekend). So now we must wait for their response. Please understand there is little to do at this juncture until they have responded. Our attorneys will continue to research and be prepared for the hearing, when scheduled.
2. The City of Abbeville mailed "utility bills" for the \$150 encroachment fee. They state that it is due May 25th (which is a Saturday). IF you do decide to pay the fee, PLEASE put this on your payment (check etc) to state that you are paying under protest:
 - a. Something to this effect should be enough: **"I AM PAYING THIS UNDER PROTEST NOT WAIVING ANY RIGHTS I HAVE NOW OR IN THE FUTURE UNDER LAW"**
3. We are working on a Fund-Raiser to help raise funds. You will be hearing more of this coming soon!

WHAT WE NEED TO DO NOW:

We have started to collect funds to cover the cost of litigation. **This may be costly to fight...**so please be prepared for it. Remember--the City of Abbeville is trying to get \$165,000 A YEAR from the property owners by charging the dock encroachment fee. Any monies collected for this purpose will be tracked and if there are any monies left over it will be given (pro-rated) back to those that donated. This is how it should be.

There are "3" ways that you can contribute. PLEASE BE CAREFUL OF SCAMMERS.

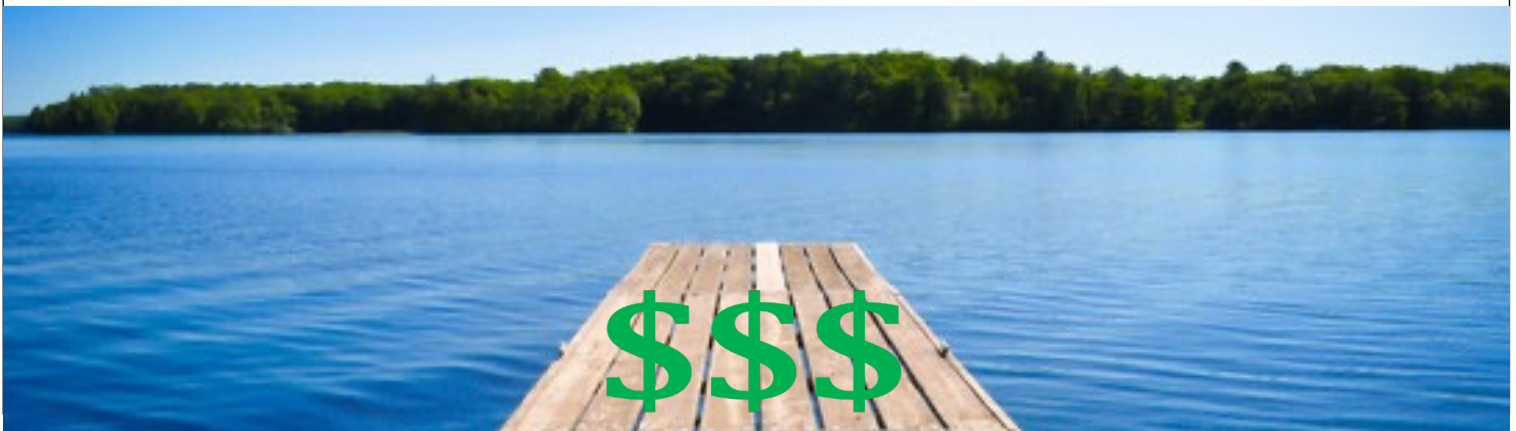

Fishing Report

Hello,

Crappie for the most part have spawned out and will be heading back to brush pile to rest and recuperate. During this time, it's best to fish small minnows over the brush or drop a buoy marker on the brush and back off and pitch jig to the marker. You can also catch them under lights at night around the brush or bridge columns. Bass will also be finishing up their spawn in the next few weeks and will be hungry. While they are still on the beds, look for the big females to be in small pockets or laying next to stumps or logs. Try throwing a creature bait over the bed and pull it into the bed. Zoom Brush Hogs or Lizard should work well. Some will also be schooling chasing bait early and late in the day. Lucky Craft Gun-fish or IMA Little Stik will catch these fish. Catfish will soon start their spawn and run up the creeks and into the shallows. For channel cats use Red-Worm or cut herring fished on the bottom.

There are some BIG (40-50 pound) flatheads in Secession. To target them use big live bream for bait. Use big rods, lines and hooks too. Your standard crappie set-up just won't bring them in. With the weather in the 70's and 80's, it's the perfect time to get out and enjoy God's creation and enjoy fishing with a friend or tutoring a young person! Come see us at Sportsman's One Stop and we'll send you in the right direction.
